Thoughts on Approaching the Last Week of Lent


Fasting, prayer and forgiveness are central to encountering the Lord in new ways during Lent. Yet, forgiveness seems to be very difficult for so many. Forgiveness is an essential tenet of Christianity. Contrary to popular wisdom, forgiveness is not forgetting. Forgiveness means that the offense no longer possesses the power to hurt us, but rather (redirects our lives in a new and fuller direction.

We all know that it is not easy because it is more than a declaration or a feeling. Jesus offers the way of forgiveness as THE way of true health and wholeness. Hear the words of Our Lord's Prayer: "Forgive us our sins AS we forgive those who sin against us." Jesus forgives and wants us to do the same.

As we approach the last week of Lent and Holy Week, *practice forgiveness*. Ask for, and offer, forgiveness. Invite God in the power of the Holy Spirit to help you with this. Do not be surprised if the release is slow to arrive, but peace will come.

And I will see you at Eastertime when our Alleluias return!!


events in all. There is something for everyone -- music, dance, theater, visual arts, cuisine, and heritage.
