### Black History Month Program Will Inspire

Sunday, February 17 at 5:30 is the next Jazz Vespers pro-

gram at St. Cyprian's, and a powerful pair will be there to entertain and educate. Mama Blue returns with her signature style and bluesy-jazzysoul sound. Folio Weekly readers recently voted her Best Female Vocalist in Jacksonville. Her visits to St. Cyprian's are always a special occasion.



The history of the civil rights movement in St. Augustine will be the subject of David Nolan's talk. Nolan is a writ-



er and historian who was recently named One of "Ten Who Make a Difference" in St. Augustine. Called a "national treasure," Nolan helped to shine a light on the city's black history. He is a popular speaker who's been welcomed at St. Cyprian's for previous programs.

# New Sound System Installed



The concert program will feature Saint Augustine soprano **Lisa Lockhart**; Orlando mezzo-soprano **Taylor-Alexis Dupont**; Jacksonville jazz singer **Mama Blue**; and bass-baritone **Carl** 

**DuPont** from Charlotte, North Carolina. The program will be accompanied on the piano by **Bonita Wyke** and hosted by FCO Artistic Director **Curtis Tucker**.




# Starting the New Year with Dignity
