On the 16th, the pews were packed for Lessons and Carols, a traditional program of scripture and music illuminating the Christmas story. Following the service was a trolley ride to see the Nights of Lights. Also, participants

enjoyed mingling in the Mission House while feasting on Jim Vande Berg's celebrated chili.

Christmas Eve again brought over 100 to St. Cyprian's for a Festival Eucharist. Soft candlelight and fragrant greens provided a warm atmosphere to celebrate the feast of the Incarnation with music, scripture, and a message of hope



from Fr. Ted — hope that God's Incarnated Presence has the power to bring our hurting world into the dawn of a new day.

The power of Jesus to do that shines especially brightly at St. Cyprian's on Friday and Saturday nights this season. The church is a temporary home for the homeless, welcoming St. Augustine's Dining with Dignity to its cam-



pus. This program, in which some 40 groups provide a warm meal for the homeless every night of the year, is displaced from its regular location downtown to accommodate peak-season parking.

With St. Cyprian's

leadership and dedicated congregation, it will undoubtedly continue to 'take seriously what Jesus took seriously' and spread the Christmas spirit throughout the coming year.

## Altar Guild







## The Bells of St. Cyprian's

#### The Bell in the Belfry

Have you noticed that you no longer hear the ringing of the church bell before our worship on Sunday morning? The rope that hangs next to the Baptismal Font snakes its way through the church ceiling into the belfry atop the

steep roof of the church. In the belfry the rope winds around a large wheel connected to the bell. When a person pulls on the rope the wheel in the belfry moves causing the bell to hit the clangor hanging inside the bell. At least that is how it is supposed to work. Somehow, a few months ago, the rope came off the wheel ... and it is a long way up to the belfry to put it back on. But, we are working on it, and hope to have it back ringing real soon.

#### The Bell at the Prelude

During the Church's season of Advent we began our worship with the ringing of a Tibetan singing bowl, followed by the organ Prelude. We started this practice simply because the congregation was very loud in the moments before the service began as people greeted each other, and when Kathy Vande Berg played the Prelude ... an indication that the service was beginning ... it seemed to be a com-



petition between the organ and loud voices. So, we needed a way mark the separation between our friendly time and our worship time ... and the Tibetan singing bowl seems to get people's attention. Now, for a few minutes, members of the congregation have an opportunity to gather their thoughts and offer their private prayers before our communal worship begins with the Opening Acclamation and Response.

If you are looking for a prayer to prepare yourself for worship this is the one that I pray with the Acolyte and Chalicist every Sunday morning in the sacristy:

Almighty and eternal God, so draw our hearts to you, so guide our minds, so fill our imaginations, so control our wills, that we may be wholly yours, utterly dedicated to you, and then use us, we pray, as you will, and always to your glory and the welfare of your people: through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

## Year-End Report

St. Johns Ecumenical Food Pantry is one of St. Cyprian's ongoing outreach ministries. The church supports this important community program through donations of food, money, and time.

The church has a collection basket on Sundays for food items. It accepts monetary donations during the Offering. In addition, a team staffs the food pantry on the second Tuesday of the month.

St. Cyprian's donated 275 items of food in December and, for the year, a grand total of 2,392 items *plus* \$1,324 in cash. Also in 2018, volunteers totaled over 80 hours of time at the food pantry.

## A Warm Meal on a Cold Night


The monthly outing to feed the homeless at Dining with Digni-
