Eleven or twelve years ago, I attended a CREDO conference for "retired" clergy. The question I had then was, "What will I do in retirement?"

Well, I found out! And it opened the opportunity to accept Bishop Howard's invitation to serve as St. Cyprian's Vicar ... supposedly part time and for two or three years. Ten years later the Episcopal Church's Pension Group has invited




me to participate in another CREDO conference. So I will be off to North Carolina for a couple of weeks while Pastor Deena fills in at the church.

CREDO conferences provide clergy at various stages of ministry with a specially designed seven-day experience. Conference participants are involved in a program of learning, sharing, reflection, worship, exploration, and laughter. There are large-group plenaries, component workshops, small-group interactions, one-on-one discussions, daily worship, prayer, and free time for exercise and relaxation ... all focused on holistic health.

"Becoming Ourselves Again: Reclaiming Our Core Values" is one of the resources we will use to clarify our personal priorities. The culmination of the conference is a CREDO Rule of Life ... a personal covenant that I will create from the knowledge attained and aspirations uncovered during the CREDO experience. It is intended that CREDO participants will leave feeling refreshed and reinvigorated, with a clearer vision of their total well-being.

Please include me in your prayers while I'm gone. I promise to return with a renewed enthusiasm for this wonderful ministry at St. Cyprian's.



In the month of **April**, St. Cyprian's collected **240** items of food for **St. Johns Ecumenical Food Pantry.**

The church's **volunteer day** on May 14 was unusually busy due to the generous donations from the church, plus a huge USDA delivery on the 9th, and 10,200 lbs. of groceries brought in from the US Postal Service Annual Food Drive.

May's team of seven provided 21 families with a total of 30 orders of food. One man who'd recently moved to Hastings called with a special request, and two volunteers had the rare opportunity to deliver groceries directly to his door.


Parish Serves 72-80 at Dining with Dignity
